• The only cost is a \$75 registration fee.

How long is INSIGHT?

• Students will be there for nine days.

Will students have to share a dorm room?

 Students will have a roommate and will share bathroom facilities.

Will students have any recreational opportunities?

 Students will participate in a variety of activities which may include: goalball, bowling, a picnic provided by the Morehead Lion's Club, off campus trips

How many years can a student attend?

• Students are eligible to attend IN-SIGHT for two years.

Will there be homework?

 Students will be required to complete homework assigned by Morehead professors and/or INSIGHT staff.

INSIGHT Post-Secondary Preparation Program



The INSIGHT Post-Secondary Preparation Program is the only program in the Commonwealth of Kentucky dedicated to promoting college and career readiness for students who are blind or visually impaired. The program is open to students who have completed grades 10-12 and are interested in attending a post secondary institution after graduating from high school.

INSIGHT takes place on the beautiful campus of Morehead State University in Morehead, KY. The students stay in a Morehead University dorm, eat in the cafeteria and attend a Morehead college class.





The program was designed to promote self-advocacy and independent living for students that are blind or visually impaired so that they may experience what it will be like to go to college.

While at Morehead, students will attend an INSIGHT class which consists of the following skills:

- Hiring a reader
- Choosing a college
- Developing a Vision Portfolio
- Note Taking Skills
- Technology
- Time Management
- Working with Morehead's Disability Coordinator

Each student will receive Orientation and Mobility and will be provided with an assessment at the completion of the program.
